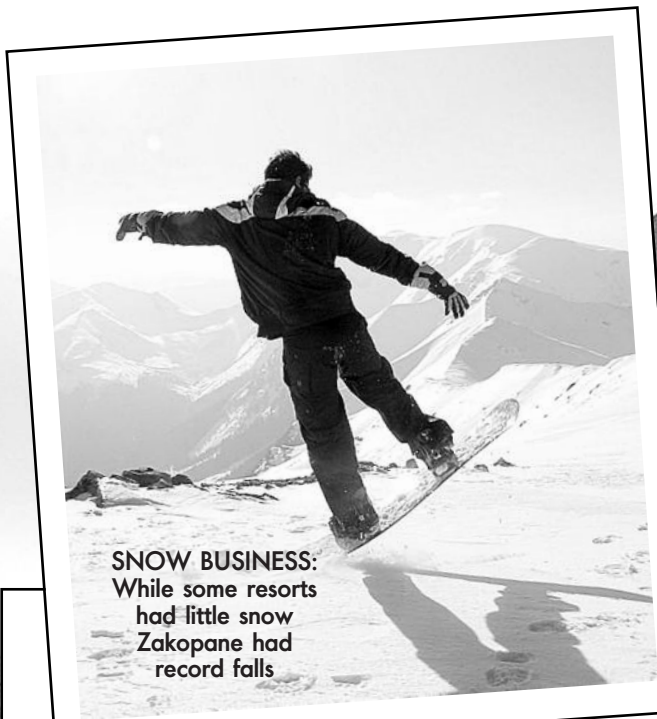

GOUGH Whitlam was the charismatic Australian Labour Prime Minister from the 1970s who believed socialism meant everyone could own an Armani suit.

Alan Garcia, managing director of Sunshine World, whether he realises it not, is a bit of a leftie too.

In 2005 he set up his company to bring high-quality skiing at rock-bottom prices – at £350 for a week's all-in half-board holiday, it's sport for the masses.

If you've never been skiing, or if you have but were frozen by some of the costs of the resorts in France, Italy, Austria or Switzerland, Sunshine World is for you.

The secret, if you can call it that, is Sun-

shine World turned its back on the established resorts of St Gervais, Meribel or Zermatt and set up camp in Zakopane, southern Poland.

It may be new to us but for the Poles it's been their winter capital for 100 years and the pistes are among Europe's best.

It's no longer hard to get there. A two-hour easyJet flying direct flight from

Belfast, a 90-minute transfer via a steepening road where the air gets thinner and fields becomes whiter and you're there.

You never get a second chance to make a good first impression and I liked Zakopane from the start.

Glacial night air was charged with the heady aromas of cinnamon and spices from steaming vats of mulled wine while roasting pork hissed over glowing spits as crowds of snugly wrapped people milled over its ancient cobbled streets. Music was
